LET COMMUNITIES LEAD WORLD AIDS DAY 2023

The world can end AIDS with communities leading the way. Organisations of communities living with, at risk of, or affected by HIV are the front line of progress in the HIV response. Communities connect people with person-centred public health services, build trust, innovate, monitor the implementation of policies and services and hold providers accountable.

But communities are being held back in their leadership. Funding shortages, policy and regulatory hurdles, capacity constraints, and crackdowns on civil society and marginalised communities' human rights are obstructing the progress of HIV prevention and treatment services. If these obstacles are removed, community-led organisations can add even greater impetus to the global HIV response, advancing progress towards the end of AIDS.

World AIDS Day 2023 is more than a celebration of the achievements of communities; it is a call to action to support communities in their leadership roles and unleash the full potential of their leadership to enable the end of AIDS.

Community leadership roles need to be made core in all HIV plans and programmes and in their formulation, budgeting, implementation, monitoring and evaluation. "Nothing about us without us."

Community leadership roles need to be fully and reliably funded to enable the required scale-up, and they need to be properly supported and remunerated. "Not ending AIDS is more expensive than ending it."

Barriers to community leadership roles need to be removed. An enabling regulatory environment which facilitates the role of the community in the provision of HIV services, ensures civil society space and protects the human rights of all (including marginalised communities) is needed to advance the global HIV response. "Remove laws that harm; create laws that empower."

Communities are and always have been leading World AIDS Day.

Because change depends not on a moment but on a movement, Brigstowe will ensure the message "Let Communities Lead" will ring out on the day and continue to echo throughout December and beyond.

"The end of AIDS is possible; it is within our grasp", says UNAIDS Executive Director Winnie Byanyima. "To follow the path that ends AIDS, the world needs to let communities lead."

Empowering students to become the generation that ends HIV stigma this World AIDS Day

Chiva is a national charity (with its head office in Bristol) working directly with children, young people and young adults living with HIV and their families.

Chiva's mission is to ensure that children, young people and young adults growing up with HIV become healthier, happier and more in control of their own futures.

Opportunity for Schools

A new education toolkit, developed by the Chiva Youth Committee (children and young people living with HIV), has been launched this year at a Parliamentary event and Chiva is offering to facilitate sessions in secondary schools using the toolkit.

The toolkit is designed to educate young people in key stages 3 and 4 with the facts about HIV in an engaging way and inspire them to become the generation that ends HIV stigma.

The toolkit is used alongside a screening of Chiva's award-winning short film, Life Growing Up. The film provides insights into the lived experiences of young people growing up with HIV in the UK.

Sessions could be timed to coincide with World AIDS Day, or could be scheduled for other times during the year, for example when schools are covering Relationships and Sex Education.

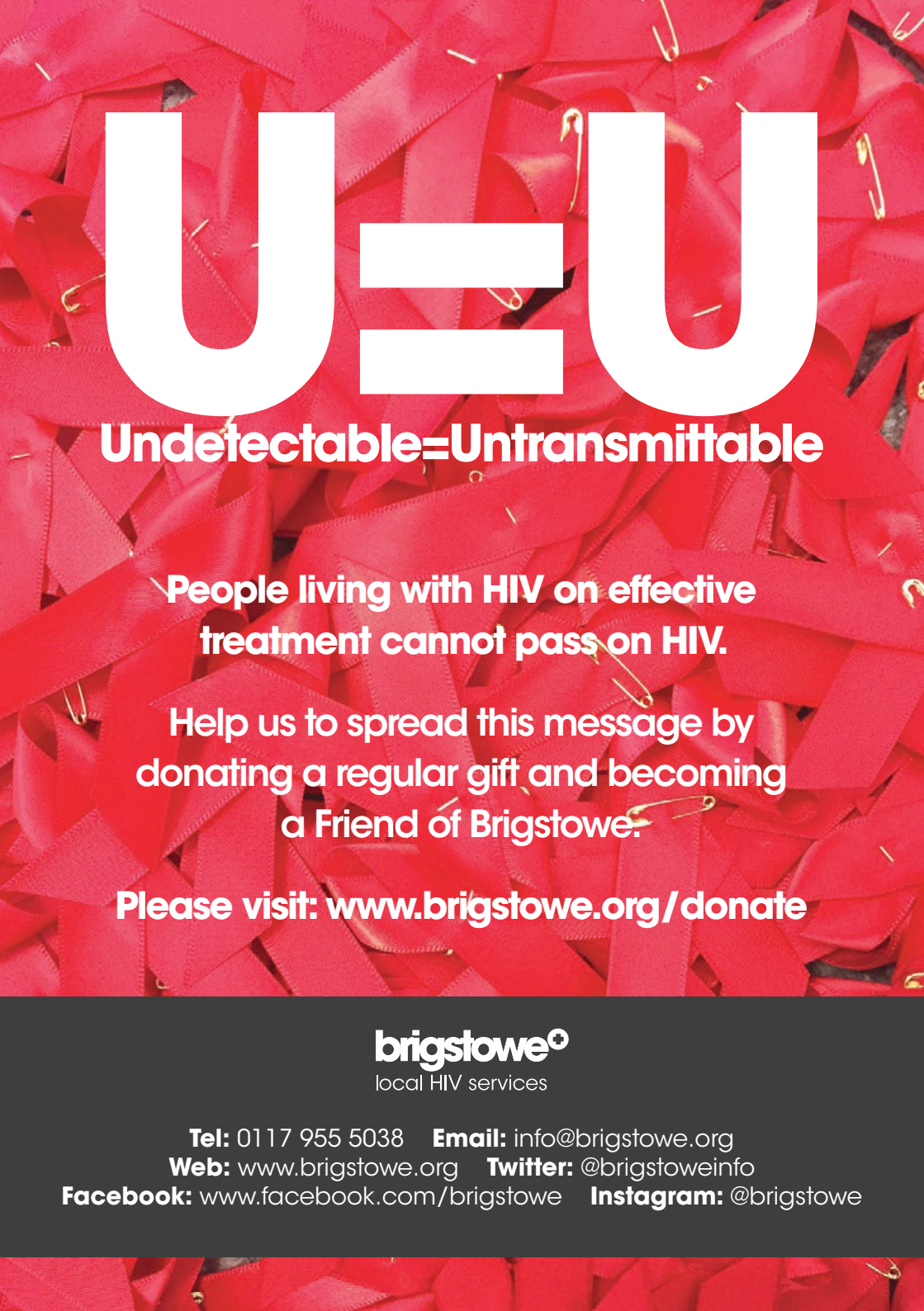
